

A Century of History from the 1900's to nowadays



Responding to a socio-cultural need expressed for some time by various sectors of the San Severino community, the MUSEUM OF CULTURES AND COMMUNICATIONS was recently created and opened to the public by Dr. Domenico Fimiani.



The Museum intends to bear witness to what has been achieved over almost a century, in order to understand and bring together social and cultural realities, either at a national level or in a cosmopolitan scenario. It is not just about technological progress but also about popular traditions, historical periods, knowledge of other cultures, craftsmanship and much more that also represent family needs and uses.

Our Museum unfolds in various sectors, reviving the memories of those who lived through those historical periods or illustrating to those who have never known the slow proceeding of social and technological progress, the aspects ignored or assimilated for their everydayness.

The itinerary begins with the exhibition of emblematic radio set of American European production in and 1930s/1950s, of American dome or art deco style receivers, of devices the 1930s and 1940s. from continues with the exhibition of some examples of the galena radios which were the forerunners of the future valve radios which, although improved, later had to give way to **transistors**.

We also collect some radios of the european authoritarian regimes.

The devices show the evolution of styles and various technical solutions.

The itinerary continues with the exhibition of movie cameras, photo cameras and their accessories, binoculars, etc.



Other displays contain household objects (coffee makers, table clocks, lamps, travel objects, floral arrangements).



For sea lovers, we show some navigation instruments with their info cards.
Also some naval models are on

display.


Another display case shows comics and vintage newspapers, books and so on.


Once around the corner, vintage sewing machines, typewriters and calculators recall the evolution of uses.

Other showcases display an excursus of **Oriental Art** from far contries as Tibet, Nepal, India, Morocco and Egypt.



Displays conserve various curiosities from toys to inkwells and vintage pens, glasses, lighters and wristwatches,





On the walls there are carpets from Tibet to Afghanistan as well as Buddhist religious paintings (*thangka*).

Near to the objects there are a lot of information cards that explain their origin and use.
